Zakat Policy

Introduction

Sufra NW London provides a zakat distribution service for local Muslim donors who are keen to

support poverty alleviation in their own community.

Zakat is a pillar of the Islamic faith and a form of charitable giving that is obligatory on believing

Muslims.

Types of Zakat

Zakat takes two main forms:

Zakat al-Mal – an annual financial donation of 2.5% of liquid and fixed assets (assessed at a

fixed point during the year) for distribution to the poor and destitute. This form of zakat can be

paid at any time of the year but is traditionally donated during the Muslim month of Ramadan.

Zakat al-Fitr – an in-kind donation of approximately 3kg of food that coincides with the festival

of Eid al-Fitr at the end of Ramadan. Most Muslims will make a financial donation in lieu which

is distributed as food by the collecting charity. The approximate value of Zakat al-Fitr is £5.

Method of Distribution

Sufra NW London distributes Zakat al-Mal as part of our Samaritan Fund that provides small

financial grants for individuals and families to cover the cost of essential living costs. Zakat al-Fitr is

used to provide in-kind donations of food to similar beneficiaries.

Although zakat funds originate from the charity's Muslim donors, they are distributed to the

needy, regardless of their faith or cultural background.

Donations that are restricted for use by a specific faith or cultural group will not be accepted by

Sufra NW London.
